

Beginning on Sunday September 14th, we will be offering a new worship opportunity at First UMC. The service will be an evening Vespers service in the Chapel at 6:00 p.m.

For those who may not be familiar with a vespers service, the word vespers comes from the Latin word meaning evening and is associated with another Latin term meaning "lamp-lighting time." Traditionally, Vespers services have been simple worship services that include the familiar elements of scripture and prayer and quiet reflection. The services are designed to be enlightening (pardon the pun) and offer insight for our daily lives.

While emphasizing the meditation quality associated with a Vespers service, each weekly service will be based upon the theme of a social issue facing our society. The service will not be political in nature, but they will focus on current events prominent in the daily news and what the Bible says about these issues facing our world.

For instance, the first service will be designed around the theme of immigration and what the Bible says about the treatment of immigrants. We will share scriptures related to the care of immigrants along with current examples of that kindness in action. There will be time to reflect, time to pray, time to ask how God is inviting you to care for the immigrants among us.

Other Sunday topics will include: what the Bible says about caring for Creation, our role in caring for the physical health of those around us, what the biblical emphasis upon the widow, poor and orphans (the vulnerable) means for us today.

The services will be designed as worship experiences and held in the Chapel every other Sunday, beginning on September 14 and 28. I hope this will be a meaningful and inspiring service that will provide some help and hope as we navigate a faithful response to the events of our day.

Book Club




