Read any travel magazine or book and they will likely list the hidden gems of a destination. These are the little-known restaurants, often a hole-in-the-wall place, which serves excellent cuisine. Or you may find a listing of the surprisingly free museums or places of interest. Such places are called hidden gems, but they are not so well known.

Here are a few that come to mind. Did you know that we have an outdoor labyrinth? This peaceful space located north of the church is a wonderful place to have a meditative walk. Labyrinths have been a sacred space in many churches and cathedrals allowing people to walk and pray. The goal of the labyrinth is to walk slowly and deliberately toward the center. It isn't a maze where you have to make choices or face getting lost. The labyrinth leads directly to the center where you can pause before returning on the exit route.

Many folks may know about the church library, walking past it on their way to the sanctuary. But have you stopped to check out the book selections? All of the books from our Sunday night book club can be found there. And some great resources for Bible study. Are the children or grandchildren coming to visit? There are some great books to read with your favorite young person. If you haven't checked out a book, stop inside some Sunday or weekday or whenever you are at the church.

Have you visited the memorial gardens? Located on the southside of the church, the memorial gardens can be found by following the walkway east of the sanctuary and down the steps. Once there, you will find a peaceful oasis where you can sit and relax, pray, read, or just have some quiet time. Along with beautiful flowers, there is a water feature that offers a soothing background to the gardens.

I may have to make this a series because there are so many other possibilities in and around the church. The chapel, the artwork in the education wing, the "little museum" inside the Blue Room and so many other hidden gems. One of the worries about sharing such places is that they will no longer be hidden, everyone will know about them. But that is ok. That is what these spaces are for. Come, explore, find a holy space, let your spirit be nourished in new and unexpected ways at Firs UMC.

Lucille Raines Residence

Lucille Raines Residence is a mission of United Women in Faith, formally known as United Methodist Women. Before the conference sponsored Ester Hall for young women coming to the city for jobs or to go to school. The United Methodist church wanted to enlarge this ministry so in 1968, the Nottingham Court Hote in Indianapolis was purchased and a two-level addition built. When the ministry moved to this new location the name was changed to Lucille Raines in honor of Bishop Richard C. Raines' wife in appreciation of her service.

For over nine years it served as a home away from home for young women as an Indiana Area project. In 1976, occupancy declined to the point it was not financially possible to continue and it was decided to close.

Evelyn Saffer, associated with the Salvation Army, asked about using the building for those seeking to turn their lives around from drug and alcohol addiction. Lucille Raines Residence opened in May 1977. Since then, Lucille Raines Residence has been home for men and women who have become undone by their own doing. They come to Raines following treatment. The United Women in Faith want this ministry to continue.

On Sunday, May 5th, Carolyn Marshall from the Lucille Raines Home will be here to share information about this important ministry of the United Methodist Church. Located in downtown Indianapolis, the Lucille Raines home has adapted its ministries with the changing needs and now serves those who are recovering from addictions, providing housing, counseling and support. Carolyn will join us in the Fellowship Hall after church to talk more about the good work they are doing. We will also be taking a special offering to support this ministry.

The Church Garden Group is excited to announce this year's Hosta Sale.


Saturday, May 11th, 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. in the Church parking lot.




Acolyte training


If your child is interested in being an acolyte, please plan to have them attend the training on May 5th at 9:30 am on the third-floor youth room.

First Quarter 2024 FUMC Financial Update

We are blessed at FUMC to have the resources to operate thanks to your financial support! We'd like to give the congregation an idea of where we are on our budget, expenses and income.

First, we have budgeted our 2024 expenses at \$732,000 against a projected income of \$585,000 resulting in a "faith gap" of \$147,000. While this faith gap is close to 50% higher than in 2023, we are monitoring our financial position closely, have faith that our income will improve through the year, and have actions we can take to reduce the size of this gap should it be needed.

Second, our "checking account" of available funds is very healthy and it meets our current target of at least 3 times our monthly expenses, which protects FUMC if we need to address any short term emergencies. This provides some space to address the faith gap in funding, but it is obviously not a sustainable long term solution.

Third, it is important to understand that it is challenging to track income versus plan because the timing of donations to the church are extremely seasonal. We generally have a large set of donations early in the year, a general slow-down mid-year, and a pick-up at the end of the year.

So, where are we after the first 3 months of 2024? Our percentage of income received versus planned YTD is 45% versus historical income target of 39%. We are above expected income to date, and have not yet needed to tap into reserve funding.

You can be rest assured that the finance committee will continue to monitor our income and spending. Thank you for your continued generosity and support of FUMC. We ask you to prayer-fully continue to support our church's financial needs, and please do let us know if you have any questions.
