Our fair city is in the perfect location for the total eclipse of the sun on Monday April 8th. I know there are some who are already lamenting the disruption this will bring to our community. This is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity for most people to see a total eclipse, and it is one of the grandest sights in all of nature. Because of the timing of the eclipse, schools have already been cancelled. Businesses are closed. (I have given the day off to our staff so they can enjoy this phenomenon.) And now we wait.



The purpose of the service will be to call our attention not only to the coming eclipse, but also to the daily beautiful mysteries that fill our hearts with awe. I hope you will consider joining me at noon that day.

One thing we cannot control is the weather. What if it is overcast and cloudy? Worse yet, what if it rains? Nothing we can do about that. But I think the power of an eclipse is that it invites us to look around and discover other holy events all around us. If it rains, we can reflect upon the beauty of a springtime rain that nourishes the crops that fill our tables and feed our bodies. If it is overcast, we can look to the heavens knowing that there is something powerful beyond what we can see directly (isn't that a great image of faith!)

I hope it is clear. I hope it is sunny. I hope we experience the fullness of this incredible moment and I look forward to sharing that delight and awe and mystery together.




Sunday School

The Care Ministry meeting will be on Monday, April 1st at 11am in the church library. Future dates for meetings are:


