

Dear Friends,

I was thinking recently about a quote from A. A. Milne's book, "The house at Pooh Corner." The quote is a conversation between the characters Piglet and Winnie the Pooh.

Piglet sidled up to Pooh from behind. "Pooh," he whispered.

"Yes, Piglet?"

"Nothing," said Piglet, taking Pooh's paw. "I just wanted to be sure of you."

What a beautiful exchange. And how full of meaning! Sometimes we just need the assurance that a loved one is nearby. Just knowing that they are there can be a great comfort in difficult times.

It reminds me of the promise that Jesus made to the disciples in his final appearance to them. He promised that he would be with them, even to the end of the age (Mt. 28:16). What comfort that must have been to the disciples, particularly in their times of uncertainty, to know that Jesus was there with them.

Or I also think of Psalm 139, which I often read to folks in the hospital. To summarize the opening verses, the psalmist asks where one can go to flee from the presence of God. If one were to ascend to the highest place or go to the depths of the earth, if one could take wing and fly to the farthest ends of the earth, even there, God is present. I find this a great comfort to think that there is nowhere we go where God is not already present. Sometimes I may feel uncertain or wonder where God is. In such times, this reading is a great assurance.

In faith, we live with the promise that God is always with us. We carry the promise that Jesus made to his disciples that he is always near. And we trust that the Holy Spirit is always present, guiding, leading, encouraging and sustaining us. These are all great gifts of faith.

But I return to the inspiring quote by A. A. Milne and find a message for the modern church. Piglet was feeling apprehensive and needed the reassurance that he was not alone. Sometimes that is true for us as well. In difficult times, we call out to hear a comforting voice. We reach out for a familiar touch. We search around for the face of a friend. And in those moments a calmness comes over us. What a gift that we can be together with and for one another, to be a source of God's comfort and a sign of God's presence.



Youth Group will be on March 3<sup>rd</sup> and March 24<sup>th</sup> from 5:00 - 7:00.




#### **Easter Morning**
